211 Access Changes in Ironbridge

Members considered for approval a response to Telford & Wrekin Council's proposals for access changes in Ironbridge aimed to control visitors and enable social distancing. The proposals included the installation of barriers along the Wharfage to keep people at a safe distance and to close Ironbridge to traffic. To date, only parking had been prohibited.

Shopkeepers were said to be upset by the proposals although they were only temporary measures. Members were informed that consultation with local parish councils would take place before any action was taken.

Members expressed a number of concerns about preventing vehicular passage through Ironbridge which included:

- o Such a proposal would re-route traffic thus creating traffic jams elsewhere.
- Broseley residents visiting the pharmacy and surgery would be inconvenienced.
- There had been no consultation with neighbouring parish councils.

Agreed there are strong concerns and expect to be fully consulted before any plans are agreed. Write to Telford & Wrekin expressing the council's concerns.

It was PROPOSED, SECONDED and AGREED to write to Telford & Wrekin Council and express the following concerns:

- Any vehicular changes in Ironbridge would have implications for the people of Broseley and Jackfield.
- If Ironbridge was restricted as a through route it would have implications for local residents visiting Telford Town Centre and Ironbridge GP and pharmacy, especially as parking would be restricted. Access to these services needs to be protected.

212 Highways

Cllr. Simon Harris reported that Cherrybrook Drive was to be resurfaced under planned maintenance by Shropshire Council. He did not know why Ironbridge Road had been closed.

NOTED.

213 Footpaths

It was **NOTED** that at the last meeting it had been agreed that the CIL Task & Finish Working Group should meet and make recommendations to the Town Council about how CIL money could be spent to upgrade footpaths within the parish of Broseley.

214 Broseley and Surrounding Area Place Plan

There was nothing to report.

215 Neighbourhood Development Plan for Broseley

Cllr. Phil Revell reported that the Town Council had already agreed that Shropshire Council's comments about the Neighbourhood Development Plan for Broseley would be discussed on 9 June 2020 and, if the Council agreed with Shropshire Council's recommendations, the Plan would be amended accordingly. If the Plan was considered to be sufficiently advanced to be considered as material consideration when responding to planning applications the Town Council would be asked to agree that the Plan be referred to when responding to planning applications and members of the public would be informed of a set date from which this would apply so that they could quote from it too.
